Disposition Consent provides Boston IVF with the final disposition directive for your cryopreserved reproductive sample(s).

Boston IVF understands that the decision to end your reproductive storage may be challenging and wants to make sure all patients feel supported. A complementary counseling session to discuss disposition is available through our wellness center.

- Read the consent completely. If you have any clinical questions, please speak with your doctor. For storage or disposition questions, please contact the lab with any questions at transports@bostonivf.com.
- > Do not make any additions or deletions to the consent.
- Consents must be signed in front of a notary. For embryo storage or donor gametes, both partners, if applicable, should complete the consents. Alternatively, you may make an appointment to sign in front of a Boston IVF team member.
- Disposition <u>cannot</u> be processed unless the consent is complete, clear, and notarized.
- Completed consents are accepted via email as long as notary seal is clear and legible.
- Storage fees will continue until completed, notarized consent is received by laboratory team to process. We will do our best to use the email date or postmark when available.
